Checklist

- Stay off your cell phone when working a match!!
- R2 Talk to shaggers end of match have them get balls and bring to the officials' table.
- R1 Talk Line judges just like we normally do.
- Protocol for National Anthem and team introductions follow NFHS guidelines. The SNOA does NOT follow the NFHS guideline about all officials (R1, R2, LJs) going to the R1 side of the court. But when you are the R1 you can dictate where you want everyone to go. We should follow the NFHS guidelines.

More

Scorekeeper and R1

- SNOA officials historically use the lineup sheet turned in by the coaches to check lineups. We use a lineup card (NFHS).
- Talk to the LT and Scorekeeper. Using our officials and Sharon O'Keefe out of Coleville.
- Hug providing clock/scoreboard person so R2 make sure he knows NOT TO STOP THE CLOCK unless directed by R2.

Referees

- Never worked with Partner so discuss:
 - How to help discrete signals, show the touch up high (it is not a discrete signal)
 - How to monitor and handle injuries...specifically...know what to do if the libero is injured and a redesignation of the libero is needed.
- Sportsmanship... manage the behavior coaches and players
- Do your best to have a post-match debrief with your partner and the LJs.
- Hopefully... no jewelry issues.

Referees

- If issue a YUD or RUD....involving subs then that sub (s) cannot happen. Don't get to substitute after getting a YUD or RUD.
- Check the Unnecessary Delay chart on page....
- Be proactive...go get the lineups before the match and between sets.

Line Judges

- Warm up eyes pre-match from your corner.
- Decide flag position on TOs (front or back)
- Gather balls from shaggers after all sets EXCEPT last set. Tell them to take balls to the table.
 - Shaggers bring balls over to table at end
 - Shaggers should NOT be playing with the balls during TOs
 - Meet the R1 and walk back together after match ends.

Scorekeepers & Libero Trackers

- Bring your own colored pens/pencils
- Scorebook and Libero tracking sheets will be on site.
- Notify R2 if a lineup hasn't been submitted pre-match or between sets. PREVENTIVE OFFICIATING
- Notify R2 of:
 - any lineup changes
 - Incorrect/improper Libero/replacements
 - Incorrect subs
 - Wrong server (at the next dead ball)

NIAA State Packet

1.State Formats

All state tournaments will have a 3-out-of-5 match, single-elimination bracket. The higher seeded team will be the home team. If the teams are equally seeded, the top team on the bracket is the home team. [Home team chooses their bench/side of the court so good practice when you arrive is to make sure the home team actually chose their bench.]

2. Warm-ups (same as regular season)

Each team will be allowed eight (8) minutes of warm-up time. The visiting team will go first.

3. Citizenship

Good sportsmanship and crowd/fan etiquette should be practiced by players and spectators.

NO thundersticks, confetti, megaphones, cowbells, whistles, sirens, airhorns, objects that would impair spectator vision (such as balloons) or other such devices / artificial noisemakers will be permitted at the matches.
